The History of Honoring Fathers

Father's Day originated on June 19th, 1909 in Spokane, Washington by Sonora Smart Dodd after listening to a Mother's Day sermon. However, her efforts to create a national movement did not transpire quickly. Surprisingly, Father's Day wasn't acknowledged as a national holiday until 63 years later in 1972 when legislation was officially signed.

In Canada & many other countries around the world, Father's Day is typically always annually celebrated on the 3rd Sunday in June to recognize the significance & show appreciation of Father's, Grandfather's & other Father figures in our life's. These contributions are acknowledged by not only individuals & families but also societies at large.

Ingredients

- 4 eggs
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 cups milk
- Fresh fruit if desired

Directions

- Cut bread into thick slices & arrange in a shallow baking dish.
- Whisk together eggs, sugar, vanilla & milk then pour over bread. Scatter fruit on top if desired then cover in fridge overnight.
- In the morning, preheat oven to low heat.
 Remove plastic & bake in oven for approximately 35 minutes (or until brown).

From S.T.E.M. to S.T.E.A.M.


STEAM is an educational approach to learning that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics as access points for guiding children's inquiry, dialogue, and critical thinking. The end results are children who take

thoughtful risks, engage in experiential learning, persist in problemsolving, embrace collaboration, and work through the creative process.

STEAM is a way to take the benefits of STEM and complete the package by

integrating these principles in and through the arts. STEAM takes STEM to the next level. It allows children to connect their learning in these critical areas together with arts practices, elements, design principles, and standards to provide the

whole pallet of learning at their disposal. STEAM removes limitations and replaces them with wonder,





S.T.E.A.M. Boat Race Activity

You can encourage STEAM learning through exploratory play at home! Children can channel their inner engineer with the boat race activity below.

Materials Needed

Cork Aluminum foil Tape (different types) Craft sticks Markers Plastic straws Empty plastic yogurt cups and water bottles Old swim noodle Other recyclables

Instructions

Work together as a family to gather recyclable materials like those listed above and design and build a few

small boats out of the recyclables. It is also important to think about where you might host your boat race – kitchen sink, pan full of water, bath tub at bath time, or outside in a puddle.

Think about which items may float, what you may need to hold the boat(s) together, etc. Ask questions of each other to make your materials selections.

Once the boats are built, have each family member, place the boats in a tub or pan full of water. Have them blow 'wind' toward the boats to see how fast the creations travel. Challenge each family

member to build a faster boat and race two of them by each blowing and/or pushing on different boats at the same time. Discuss which boat is faster and why.

As children engage with science, technology, engineering, art, and math, they are also building a strong foundation for learning in all subjects. With a little guidance from you and your child's educators, your young explorer will develop a love of STEAM and learning for life.
